1 July Stress, Rhythms and the Brain.

The human brain has evolved dramatically and quickly from more primitive animals. Not surprisingly, this can lead to problems in functioning, especially when stress or disturbance of our biological rhythms occur. This presentation will discuss what happens in the brain when we are under extreme stress or when our usual daily rhythm of sleeping and waking is disrupted, for example after earthquakes or during pandemics.

8 July The Fossil Treasures of Foulden Maar - an update.

Foulden Maar in Otago is Aotearoa New Zealand's most important fossil site. Here, hidden in diatomite layers, deposited in an ancient volcanic lake, is an amazing record of life on Earth 23 million years ago. Exquisitely preserved leaves, fragile flowers with pollen, fruits and seeds and microscopic sponges, fossil whitebait and eels, spiders, beetles, ants, termites, lace bugs, caddisflies and midges reveal a fascinating glimpse of an ancient world.

15 July Fascinating Antarctica: its Landscape, Science and History. Ursula Rack

Being aware of the past events in Antarctica is crucial to understand why we still conduct science and research in this part of the world. Over the last 250 years, history has shaped our views of the Antarctic continent. Ursula will inform us of international expeditions over the last 150 years to highlight their significance and legacy.
